

SGH and CREN SGH



- Szkoła Główna Handlowa SGH
 - Warsaw School of Economics one of the greatest Polish universities of economics
 - since 1906, the first university of economics and management in Poland.
- The Centre for Development of Distance and Permanent Education CREN
 - a special department of SGH established to organize, promote and develop SGH e-learning activity
 - since 2001.





- encouraging and organizing projects concerning online education and lifelong learning
- developing e-learning platform
- researches concerning e-learning
- organizing seminars and conferences
- e-learning magazine 'e-mentor' and other publications
- cooperation with state and foreign organizations dealing with online education and lifelong learning
- educational projects and trainings, also for companies

E-learning in SGH



- managing and developing e-sgh platform(s)[administration of accounts]
- supporting lecturers
- supporting students (access to the platforms)
- evaluation and control of e-learning lectures quality
- cooperation with offices and departaments
- laboratory with computers free access for students



@-sgh system

e-learning solution in SGH:

- 45 full online lectures on <u>www.e-sgh.pl</u> platform:
 - 38 for SGH students exclusively,
 - 5 with economics universities from Poland common online lectures (Poznań, Kraków, Katowice, Wrocław) econet project
 - 2 international lectures (in cooperation with University of Illinois)
- materials supporting obligatory clasess (blended learning)
- e-learning Library Training and Occupational Health and Safty Training (PL&EN)
- Niezbędnik e-sgh` personal application for lecturers

full online lectures standards 1 size



Characteristics of online lectures:

- official lectures in SGH offer students can choose online lecture and get ECTS credits
- **SGH** online classes are a kind of lectures with exercises
- 1 lecture must cover 30 hours in 1 semester
- materials are divided into smaller parts modules
- 1 module 1 class
- most of lectures have 10 modules, which must fill:
- -> 20 hours of a content
- -> 10 hour of activities

full online lectures standards 2 structure



Introduction

- learning goals
- a brief of course content and its structure

Main content

- + divided in parts
- + with interactive elements
- + problems to solve in discussion
- + control parts "check yourself"

Conclusion


- -reminding of lecture`s goals
- -repeating main issues

full online lectures standards 2 structure (a map of a module)





full online lectures standards 3 general directions for the content



- style of content language between talking and writing
- content logically divided
- a slide must not be overloaded
- examples, methaphors, parallels, rhetorical questions
- activating sentences
- footnotes
- graphics, diagrams, tables a title and a source

full online lectures standards 4 activities and facilitation



Activities may be assessed or just for self checking

- discussions on forum, live chats
- individual exercises
- tests, quizes
- case studies
- group works

Communication with students - systematically answering messages by internal mailbox



Moderating discussion on forums – starting discussion to every module



Assessment of students` work - scores in assessment folder, comments



Theme live chats





Meetings on-live, (optional - reccommended)




Exam - traditional in a school place

1. Author/teacher prepares paper – consults it with an instructional designer

Access to the lecture


- 1. Students choose lectures in virtual aplication of deanery (not integrated with platform ☺),
- 2. filling an electronic card, getting access to materials on platform,
- 3. terms of opening acces systematically every 2 weeks,
- 4. after final exam session access is blocked,
- assessment folders, messages from internal mailbox, posts on forum are put to the archives.

What does work in practice?

- conditions of passing the lecture clearly showed in the beginning,
- consistency (terms),
- engagement answering e-mails, moderating discussions,
- adequate activities not overloaded,
- not overloaded modules,
- possibility of printing materials,
- interesting films.



The main problems





- out of date
- content overloaded `book in html`

teacher

- lack of motivation (decreasing of motivation after several editions, not creative in teaching
- teacher who does not modere activities not answering messages,
- **lack of consequence**, not keeping terms,
- lack of interaction during assessment, no comments for scores,

students

- students` activation two days before exam
- much more work demanded than in a traditional lecture,

organization

- limited contact with a teacher,
- too large groups,
- not integrated systems of e-sgh and virtual application from administration office.
